

With adult stem cells successfully against Parkinson

What researchers worldwide work, has become reality for Johannes Wolf (72) from Saarbrücken. Eleven years ago, the first evidence of insidious disease showed at the former civil engineer. Six years doctors needed until the final diagnosis: disease Parkinson. Schüttellähmung. Unheilbares suffering and unaufhaltsamer decay until death. Johannes Wolf is a warrior. Sporty. Frühgymnastik. Everyday cycling power, ski run four miles Waldlauf tennis. And: dance with his wife. That was his life. He read everything he could find on the treatment of his illness. He visited seminars and medical Congresses, sought help in specialist clinics and research centers. No one could help him. The complaints submitted to. Sport was hardly possible. The pain were greater and experienced side effects of drugs intolerable - he of therapy with endogenous adult stem cells in the XCell Center in Cologne. Johannes Wolf: "my doctors have discouraged me." In ten years, the medicine would be perhaps as far. "But in the meantime I'm perhaps long dead. Johannes Wolf chose the stem cells. In July 2007, he was found in the XCell Center bone marrow and later got back the stem cells contained in concentrated form. Wolf: "the doctors had told me from the outset, there is no guarantee for the success of the treatment." But after four weeks was Johannes Wolf schmerzfrei, could gradually make its medicines, resume his beloved sports programme and meet a long held dream: he bought a Harley Davidson and is - eight months after stem

cell therapy and after successfully completing Fahrstunden - perhaps the only motor which has shown the parkinsonsche disease in their place.
